

Inspiring Teacher of English Leadership Award (2023)

A national award for teachers of English in Singapore schools

The **Inspiring Teacher of English – Leadership Award** recognises Heads of Department (HOD)/Subject Heads (SH)/Level Heads (LH) who have successfully led their departments and schools in the development and implementation of an effective English Language/Literature in English/General Paper curriculum. The award is presented by The Straits Times and the Speak Good English Movement, with the support of the Ministry of Education.

Principals from primary, secondary and integrated programme schools, centralised institute and junior colleges are invited to make a nomination.

There are two categories for the Inspiring Teacher of English Award – the Teaching Award and the Leadership Award. Note that each school can make only **ONE nomination per award category**. The nomination and endorsement forms for these awards can be downloaded from www.goodenglish.org.sg.

Nominations open on 1 February 2023 and all forms **MUST** reach the Speak Good English Movement **by 5pm on 10 April 2023**.

The Award

A maximum of 10 Inspiring Teacher of English Teaching/Leadership Awards will be presented every year. The judges reserve the right to present fewer than 10 awards.

Each winner will receive a \$2,000 cash award and a trophy. The award recipients' approaches to teaching English Language/Literature in English/General Paper may be published in SPH Media Trust publications.

All endorsed nominees will receive a Singapore Association for Applied Linguistics membership.

Eligibility of Nominee

1. The nominee must have been with the school for **two** years or more and be in service at the time of award.
2. The nominee should have led in developing and implementing the English Language/Literature in English/General Paper school-based curriculum for **at least two years** in the school in the capacity of Head of Department (HOD), Subject Head (SH) or Level Head (LH) of English Language/Literature in English/General Paper.
3. The nominee should have:
 - communicated a shared vision for quality teaching and learning that reflects a strong understanding of the organisational culture and the learning needs of staff and students;
 - planned an English Language/Literature in English/General Paper school-based curriculum aligned with the relevant national syllabuses to meet the readiness, interests and learning profiles of students of the school;
 - effectively implemented the school-based curriculum to develop the English Language/Literature in English/General Paper Learner Outcomes aligned with the syllabuses; and
 - developed the teaching competencies of teachers in their departments so that they are able to enact classroom practices in alignment with the syllabuses and curriculum, as well as classroom-based innovations.
4. An HOD/SH/LH who was previously nominated can be nominated again after a lapse of **one** year. For example, if a HOD/SH/LH was nominated in 2021, a re-nomination can be made in 2023.
5. The Principal must support the nomination with an endorsement form for the nominee to be eligible.

Selection Process

Part ONE: Submission of nominee's 2-part write-up and Principal's endorsement

Part TWO: Interviews for Shortlisted Nominees
Shortlisted nominees will submit their department plans/schemes of work and evidence of their inquiry into classroom practice including peer feedback and student work to MOE HQ, prior to the interviews in July/August 2023.

Part THREE: Announcement of winners
Winners will be announced through the press in October 2023.
