# NOMINATE YOUR TEACHER FOR THE INSPIRING TEACHER OF ENGLISH AWARD NOW

The *Inspiring Teacher of English Award* is the first national award for English teachers in Singapore schools. It sets out to acknowledge teachers who have been instrumental in igniting a love for the English language and are effective in helping their students speak and write better, and also have them share their teaching practices with their fellow teachers. The award is jointly presented by *The Straits Times* and the *Speak Good English Movement*, with the support of the *Ministry of Education*.

Nominations are open from today till 17 July 2008. Each winner of the award will be the proud recipient of a cash award and a trophy.

Mr Goh Eck Kheng, Chairman of the Speak Good English Movement Committee, said, "Schools form one of the front lines of improving the standard of English in Singapore, and good teachers of the language are key if we are to see this improvement happen. The Inspiring Teacher of English Award focuses awareness on the important role of English Language, Literature and General Paper teachers, and we hope that the recognition of their importance by way of this award will encourage and motivate them."

RAdm (NS) Lui Tuck Yew, Senior Minister of State, Ministry of Education & Ministry of Information, Communications and the Arts, said, "The Speak Good English Movement Committee should be commended for taking the initiative to recognise our best English teachers. I urge students, parents and fellow teachers to recommend these outstanding English teachers for the award."

We are looking for teachers who:

- are passionate about making English interesting and relevant to their students;

All students, their parents, and fellow teachers are invited to make nominations by filling up a nomination form and briefly describing why they think their nominated teacher deserves the award.

Nominations for the award are open to all in-service teachers of English (including Literature and General Paper) from primary and secondary schools, junior colleges and centralized institutes.
