# 16<sup>th</sup> INSPIRING TEACHER OF ENGLISH AWARD EIGHT TEACHERS LAUDED FOR INSPIRING A LOVE FOR ENGLISH

**5 October 2023** – Eight educators received the Inspiring Teacher of English Award (ITEA) this year. The award ceremony was held in-person today and graced by Guest-of-Honour, Director-General for Education, Ministry of Education, Ms Liew Wei Li, who presented the Inspiring Teacher of English Award (ITEA) to the recipients.

- Out of 120 nominations received this year, five recipients were awarded the Teaching Award for excellence in the teaching of English, while three recipients received the Leadership Award for leading the development and implementation of effective English programmes in their schools.
- 3. Now into its 16<sup>th</sup> year since its inception in 2008, the ITEA has recognised the exemplary contributions of a total of 135 English teachers in Singapore. During the ceremony, Guest-of-Honour, Ms Liew Wei Li, expressed her appreciation of the teachers' efforts in inspiring their students to master and use the English language effectively, which will open up a world of opportunities for them.

Mr Jaime Ho, editor of The Straits Times and award co-organiser with the Speak Good English Movement, said, "Teachers have always been at the heart of what we do as a society to develop an informed and engaged citizenry. It is therefore The Straits Times' privilege to work with teachers in reaching out to our youngest audiences, to develop a love for the English language, and an appreciation of how language helps us navigate an increasingly complex world."

Mr Jason Leow, Chairman of the Speak Good English Movement, said, "We are grateful to The Straits Times for its long-standing support towards the Inspiring Teacher of English Award as we work together with the Ministry of Education to acknowledge all the teachers who inspire a love for the English language."
- 6. The eight recipients each received a trophy, a certificate, and a cash award of \$2,000. All winners and nominees will also receive a two-year membership to the Singapore Association for Applied Linguistics. #### AWARD CATEGORIES UNDER THE INSPIRING TEACHER OF ENGLISH AWARD

# 1. Inspiring Teacher of English – Teaching Award

Started in 2008, this award category recognises English teachers in Singapore schools who have:

- exemplified the use of good spoken and written English;
- promoted learning-focused interaction during English lessons; and
- chosen pedagogies appropriate to learners' readiness, interests and learning profiles.

#### 2. Inspiring Teacher of English - Leadership Award

Introduced in 2014, this award category recognises Heads of Department (HODs) / Subject Heads (SHs) / Level Heads (LHs) who have:

- communicated a shared vision for quality teaching and learning that reflects a strong understanding of the organisational culture and the learning needs of staff and students;
- planned an English Language/ Literature in English/ General Paper programme based on the requirements of the relevant national syllabuses to meet the readiness, interests and learning profiles of students of the school;
- effectively implemented the school-based instructional programme (including enrichment and/or remedial programmes); and
- developed the teaching competencies of teachers of English so that they are better able to enact their school-based instructional programmes.
