Question 1

a is correct as it refers to a more permanent state. 'Stay(s)' is used for a temporary situation, e.g. "When I go on holiday I stay in a hotel."

Question 2

b is correct standard English. The other two are Singaporean English.

Question 3

b is correct. The only one that refers to the process of moving an object.

Question 4

b is correct. 'Revert' is normally used to describe a return to a type of behaviour, e.g. "After years of clean living, John reverted to gambling". It does not require a particle such as 'back'.

Question 5

a is correct. 'Scold' is only used when referring to small children. It is also old fashioned and rarely used nowadays.

Question 6

c is correct. The word 'cope' does not take a particle, such as 'up'.

Question 7

c is correct. 'Spoil' does not refer to machinery. It is normally used when referring to children, food or a situation such as a holiday.

Question 8

a is correct. Consider. This is a transitive verb which takes a direct object and no preposition.

Question 9

b is correct. Regretted. This is a transitive verb which takes a direct object and no preposition.

Question 10

a is correct. Luggage. This is an uncountable noun, so has no plural form.

Question 11

c is correct. A singular/plural compound adjective before a noun is hyphenated with no plural.

Question 12

c is correct. The phrasal verb 'get off' is commonly used in Standard English to replace the more formal verb. 'to alight'.

Question 13

b is correct. Past simple must be used with a specific time expression. Past perfect is not used unless there are two activities related to one another.

Question 14

b is correct. When the question is part of a longer sentence, the word order changes.

Question 15

b is correct. In present perfect sentences, the adverb 'already' is usually positioned between the auxiliary verb and the past participle.

Question 16

a is correct. Subject-verb agreement. "Making reservations in restaurants" is a finite clause and therefore considered singular, hence the use of 'is'.

Question 17

b is correct. 3rd person singular. If the noun or pronoun is the 3rd person singular 'he', 'she' or 'it', then the verb takes an 's'.

How did you do?

Top of the class!
