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SEVEN TEACHERS LAUDED FOR INSPIRING LOVE FOR ENGLISH

7 October 2021 – This year, seven educators will receive the Inspiring Teacher of English Award (ITEA) for igniting a passion for English, and for honing speaking and writing skills among their students. The award recipients were selected from 119 teachers who were nominated by their colleagues, students and parents. Of the two categories of the ITEA, four teachers will receive the Teaching Award, which recognises teachers who make lessons exciting and relevant to their students, while three teachers will receive the Leadership Award, which recognises the contributions of teacher leaders who have effectively implemented English language programmes in their schools.

- 2. Now into its 14th year, the ITEA has recognised the exemplary contributions of a total of 118 English teachers in Singapore since its inception in 2008. Second Minister for Education and Foreign Affairs, Dr Maliki Osman, who is Guest-of-Honour at this year's virtual awards presentation ceremony, said: "Today, we celebrate seven teachers who exemplify what it means to be an inspiring teacher of English. Not only do they role-model the effective use of English every day, they create environments which are conducive for the practice and usage of standard English in real-world contexts. They employ innovative pedagogies to help our students develop the skills to read with discernment, communicate with empathy, articulate with clarity, and deliver with confidence. Through their own passion for English, they inspire a similar love for the language in the next generation."
- 3. Mr Jason Leow, Chairman of the Speak Good English Movement, said, "English is a complex language that is constantly evolving. To teach it well, it requires innovation, imagination and grit. It's not an easy mission. The Speak Good English Movement applauds and thanks the award recipients and nominees for their effort."

Annex B

AWARD CATEGORIES UNDER THE INSPIRING TEACHER OF ENGLISH AWARD

1. Inspiring Teacher of English – Teaching Award

Started in 2008, this award category recognises English teachers in Singapore schools who have:

- exemplified the use of good spoken and written English;
- promoted learning-focused interaction during English lessons; and
- chosen pedagogies appropriate to learners' readiness, interests and learning profiles.

2. Inspiring Teacher of English – Leadership Award

Introduced in 2014, this award category recognises HODs/ Subject Heads/ Level Heads who have:

- communicated a shared vision for quality teaching and learning that reflects a strong understanding of the organisational culture and the learning needs of staff and students;
- planned an English Language/ Literature in English/ General Paper programme based on the requirements of the relevant national syllabuses to meet the readiness, interests and learning profiles of students of the school;
- effectively implemented the school-based instructional programme (including enrichment and/or remedial programmes); and
- developed the teaching competencies of teachers of English so that they are better able to enact their school-based instructional programmes.
