If the **subject** is plural,
you use a plural verb



The **dogs** jump over
the fence.

They dance very well.



Mary and her friends
are going to the library
this afternoon.



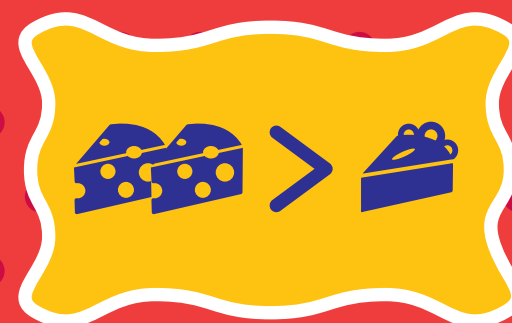
Don't forget who/what and where your **subject** is.

unable to attend the meeting.



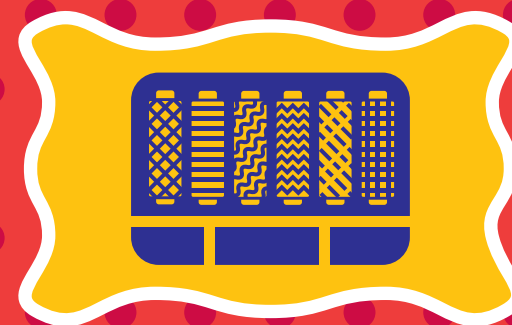
Two slices of cheese cake cost
