

BULAN BAHASA 2022 YOUTHS REVITALISE OUR LOVE FOR THE MALAY LANGUAGE

3 September 2022 – Majlis Bahasa Melayu Singapura (MBMS or Malay Language Council, Singapore) presented the official launch of Bulan Bahasa 2022 via telecast on Mediacorp Suria, at 8.30pm on Saturday, 3 September 2022. The launch was graced by our Guest-of-Honour, Minister in the Prime Minister's Office, Dr Maliki Osman, who is also Second Minister for Education and Foreign Affairs. A Programme Featuring Young Performers and Presenters

This year's launch programme featured a line-up of young performers and presenters, with an enticing music arrangement by Duta Bahasa, Megat Firdaus. The programme featured performances of evergreen songs, with modern music arrangements, performed by young artistes such as Qis Maraj, Syaz Smooth and Rahila Rashun. There was also a *syair* declamation by Malay language and literary activist, Afi Hanafi and poem recitation by newly appointed Duta Bahasa, Hans Hamid and Fir Rahman.

To keep the youthful spirit in promoting interest in the Malay language, the programme also featured Rakan Bahasa from Haig Girls' School and Paya Lebar Methodist Girls' School (Secondary). In these segments, they shared their aspirations and involvement in Bulan Bahasa 2022 and interacted with Duta Bahasa Hans Hamid and Fir Rahman in a guiz.

The Pantun, a Key Element in the Programme

The *pantun* (Malay rhymed quatrains) was a key element throughout the lively programme as seen from the *pantun* exchanges between hosts Adi Rahman and Huda Ali with Dr Maliki Osman, Prof Faishal Ibrahim, MBMS Chairman and Mdm Rahayu Mahzam, Duta Bahasa and Chairman of the Bulan Bahasa Committee. The hosts also engaged the audience in the studio with *pantun* exchanges. The use of *pantun* was also presented in an original song performance titled 'Pantun Bulan Bahasa' by MBMS member, Shahril Samri and singer-songwriter Ryan Sufiyan. The lyrics of this song featured a series of *pantun* written by Shahril, with music composed by Duta Bahasa Megat Firdaus.
