

BULAN BAHASA 2024: CELEBRATING OUR YOUTHS

Bulan Bahasa 2024 will take place this year from 17 August to 13 October, with a calendar full of programmes organised by the community, to foster an appreciation for the Malay language. Bulan Bahasa also strengthens its focus on youths this year, with specific programmes dedicated at piquing their interest and encouraging them to express their confidence in speaking the language.

The Official Launch Ceremony for Bulan Bahasa will be televised over Mediacorp Suria, at 8.30pm on Saturday, 7 September 2024. The Majlis Bahasa Melayu Singapura (MBMS or Malay Language Council, Singapore) invites members of the public, especially the youths in the community, to participate in-person at the programme recording session which will take place at Mediacorp, on Friday, 2 August 2024. Registration for attendance at the programme recording via <u>https://go.gov.sg/bb24launchgen</u> is required by 22 July 2024, and confirmation of seats will be subject to availability.

To further engage our youths and members of the community, MBMS and Mediacorp Suria invite everyone to create lyrics related to the Malay language and culture for a 30-second music piece arranged by Duta Bahasa (Language Ambassador), Megat Firdaus. Shortlisted submissions will be featured during the Official Launch Ceremony for Bulan Bahasa 2024.

"We take the opportunity during the Bulan Bahasa celebrations to encourage programme partners to organise Malay language activities that would attract youths. It is important for our youths to learn and appreciate their mother tongue as this will help them foster a strong sense of identity, and facilitate better communication with family and community. This year, we also feature youths within our pool of programme partners that will be conducting programmes for the young, and we hope that the programme topics and genres will resonate. Bulan Bahasa 2024 is a call to action for everyone to revitalise their Malay language use and promotion efforts," says Zhulkarnain Abdul Rahim, Chairman of the Bulan Bahasa Committee 2024.



Bulan Bahasa 2024 Programmes from 17 August to 13 October

Various community and constituency partners, interest groups and schools continue to come forward to present programmes for Bulan Bahasa 2024. To stay relevant with the young, some partners and individuals have come forward to create digital programmes to introduce some fun in using and learning the language.

Listen to **Hidayat Nordin** in his second edition of **Sapot!** podcasts where he discusses topics related to Malay arts, culture, literature and current trends alongside his co-hosts, Shahril Samri and Duta Bahasa Aqmal N. 'Sapot' is a Malay colloquial term referring to 'support'. In this podcast series, the hosts engage with invited youths from ITE, polytechnics and universities for fun and light-hearted discussions in various episodes.

Explore the art of *dikir barat* with the **Singapore Dikir Barat Federation** where they engage all members of public in **e-Rama Dikir**, a competition to be held on digital platforms. In this competition, they invite the young to showcase their creativity with their friends and family by creating videos containing their original *dikir barat* lyrics and choreography. The top entries will stand a chance to win cash prizes.

Test your knowledge of the Malay language with students participating in **Cepat Tepat**, a televised game show sponsored by the **Malay Language Learning and Promotion Committee (MLLPC)** and supported by Mediacorp. Held in conjunction with Bulan Bahasa for the third time, this programme promises fun through play while discovering the beauty of the Malay language.

Connect with the Malay language through batik painting with **Kamal Arts' Batik Bersama**. In this workshop, participants will learn about different flowers native to the Malay World, and how to paint them. In explaining their painting in detail, participants will be learning and incorporating the different Malay terms related to colour and tones. Discover the craft of comic drawing and writing in **Kamal Arts'** other workshop, **Karya Komik**, where participants will learn how to produce engaging and effective comic stories in Malay.

Bulan Bahasa 2024 Creative Identity and Collateral

This year's creative identity for Bulan Bahasa is aligned with its focus on youths. Utilising silhouettes and a play with letters, a dynamic visual is created which invites viewers to guess the objects embedded creatively behind the words. For example, the letter 'A' in 'Cita' contains a *gasing*, the letter 'I' in 'Citra' features a *congkak* and the letter 'T' in 'Cinta' features a *keris*. The full stop after each word is symbolised by a *songket* motif called *bintang bunga*.

The placement of the letters and objects aims to depict the dynamism of the Malay language as one that is not static, but ever-evolving though deeply rooted in tradition.

The main creative identity will be featured on select collateral such as files and stickers to be produced for Bulan Bahasa 2024. These will be available for distribution to Bulan Bahasa programme participants via our partners.






Appointed Duta Bahasa since 2010
