BULAN BAHASA CELEBRATES TIMELESS TRADITIONS AT THE MALAY HERITAGE CENTRE

9 September 2017 – *Bulan Bahasa* 2017 (Malay Language Month 2017) was officially launched at the Malay Heritage Centre in Kampong Gelam, on Saturday 9 September.

From 15 August to 15 October, *Bulan Bahasa* will offer a variety of **more than 100 programmes**, events and activities that will showcase the vibrancy of the Malay language, while preserving treasured aspects of *Bahasa Ilmu* (Knowledge), *Bahasa Budaya* (Culture) and *Bahasa Mesra* (Relationships).

A Day of Festivities at the Malay Heritage Centre

Once known as the Istana Kampong Gelam, the Malay Heritage Centre is home to artefacts and displays symbolic to the Malay community. Its gallery narrative also charts significant moments in history that has influenced and shaped the Malay community in Singapore.

Today, visitors were treated to a sampling of Malay language and culture activities within the museum, out on its compound, and outdoors on the streets of Bussorah Mall. Some programmes were also presented in both Malay and English, to cater to multi-racial visitors and to engage them in an appreciation of Malay language, culture and heritage.

At the launch ceremony, Ms Rahayu Mahzam, Chairman of the Bulan Bahasa Committee, expressed her thanks to partners, donors and sponsors for their continued support of this annual event. She also took the opportunity to stress the importance of preserving the Malay language and culture, to ensure the community's legacy, stories and values survive the test of time. "The beauty of the Malay language and culture needs to be shared, especially with our younger ones, to ensure its continuity and timelessness," says Ms Rahayu Mahzam.
