A VIBRANT SHOWCASE OF THE VERSATILITY OF THE MALAY LANGUAGE AT BULAN BAHASA 2013

Bulan Bahasa returns for its 27th year with a festive two-day launch full of activities that celebrate and demonstrate the versatility of the Malay Language.

This year, Bulan Bahasa will be focusing on just three of the many characteristics of the Malay Language – Bahasa Ilmu (Knowledge), Bahasa Budaya (Culture) and Bahasa Mesra (Human Relationships/Networks) – highlighting the multifaceted nature of the language and its various functions in society.

“Every year, we do our best to include everyone from the Malay community, and this year we have engaged individuals, organisations and groups to create programmes that allow the community to experience this year’s theme that portrays the richness and importance of the Malay language” explains Mr Zaqy Mohamad, Chairman, Bulan Bahasa 2013. “We all own the Malay language and it is our responsibility to ensure it is protected and continues to thrive among the younger generation and for generations after.”

The Malay Language Month 2013 will be launched on 7 September 2013 at the River Room, Asian Civilisations Museum (ACM), with Mr Lawrence Wong, Acting Minister for Culture, Community and Youth as the Guest of Honour.

Exciting Start to a Month of Malay Programmes

Visitors to the Asian Civilisations Museum and the Museum’s Green today and tomorrow will be treated to a carnival of interactive programmes that appeal to all ages. This is the first time Bulan Bahasa is partnering a museum for its launch, a partnership that represents the importance of language in understanding and appreciating one’s culture and heritage. The beautiful and historical grounds of the Asian Civilisations Museum also lend itself well to the various genres of activities that have been specially created by partners.

Music

The stage is set on the ACM Green for two consecutive evenings of music by Art Fazil and friends. Aptly named “Pentas Seloka”, referring to a traditional Malay free form style of poetry, Art Fazil has put together an impressive mix of acts from Hip Hop to Blues and the romantic Dondang Sayang. Music lovers will also get to experience a very special appearance and performance by the legendary 92 year old Momo Latif.



Families

Families can also spend time at the Green learning how to craft their own *Batik* pieces and *Wau* (Malay Kites) while playing traditional games such as *Gasing*. For a cooler activity, the Learning Gallery with an array of specially-selected collection of Malay-language books is a good option as families can read together or kids can learn from a student buddy from the Madrasahs.

Sports

Sports fans can also get their adrenaline pumping high during the weekend. On Saturday, be wowed by the powerful yet graceful moves of the *Silat* practitioners decked out in their traditional attire. On Sunday, the Courts Young Lions team will drop by to meet and play friendly matches with the public.

Theatre

Theatre enthusiasts are not left out either. Head to the Ngee Ann Auditorium for an updated *Bangsawan* performance based on a narrative from “Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows” by TEATRO Temasek Polytechnic. Teater Artistik will also put on a moving show comprising of three monologues in “The Artistic Monologue Project”.
