Tamil Language Festival 2020

The Tamil Language Council (TLC) is pleased to announce that a virtual Tamil Language Festival (TLF) will be taking place from 28 November to 20 December 2020. Despite the postponement of the TLF 2020 originally scheduled for April, due to Covid-19, the TLC and its partners have assembled a total of 25 online programmes, as the community remains steadfast in its goal to promote the Tamil language in Singapore.

The community can look forward to participating in a variety of literary, oratorical, arts and cultural programmes via Zoom or Facebook platforms. These programmes will encourage everyone to "Love Tamil, Speak Tamil", embrace their mother tongue, and use the language in their daily lives.

A festival for all

TLF 2020 welcomes 6 new partners, as they present programmes featuring storytelling, drama, musical and talks that would broadly appeal to everyone.

NoolaPalooza, a digital storytelling programme for pre-schoolers and primary school students is presented by Nool Monsters. The dramatised storytelling session will introduce interesting characters such as the Ten-Headed boy, a musical T-Rex, dare-devil animals and a topsy-turvy monsters, as participants join the sing-along to rhymes and stories.

Brahmastra, a new partner to the festival, will present "Kuralum Kuralum" a musical with a live band presenting Thirukkural. The Thirukkural and its explanations will be presented using Tamil cinematic songs.

Kalamanjari is also a new partner to the festival. The performance "Nanneri Thangam" will present a musical with a poetry recital. This presentation will also be supplemented by a discourse on the featured poetry.

Tertiary students may also be interested in a photography competition organized by the Nanyang Technological University Tamil Literary Society Alumni Association. The competition aims to engage participants to express their perspectives of the local Tamil poems, through photography.

Singapore Kadayanallur Muslim League, an active partner in the TLF will be presenting "Tamil Unaarvodhu Unavu", a cooking demonstration. This demonstration will share about the forgotten traditional Indian dishes and spices, and the history of early immigrants from Kadayanallur. At the end of the programme, participants can takeaway new recipes for their own use at home.
